Paul read Robert Louis Stevenson's *Jekyll & Hyde* at the age of nine and at 20 started to write a musical about the story...only to find out one was already written!!! Not giving up, he re-wrote his musical as a screenplay...which has never been finished!! Paul has already appeared in *Jekyll & Hyde* in the excellent CCADS version some four years ago as the sober John Utterson, and is delighted now to play the title role under the expert direction of JP McCrohan. With only ten weeks of rehearsal time, Paul's descent into madness and despair has been totally genuine, saved only by a wonderful, supportive cast and musical director. Previous roles include Henry Higgins in last year's *My Fair Lady*, Curly in *Oklahomal*, Fagin in *Oliver* and Billy Bigelow in *Carousel*. Paul hopes 'you' and 'you' will enjoy the show!

#### The Lover

Emma Carew - Lizzy Leggat

Lizzy is 20 and originally from Maidstone in Kent. She is currently studying Creative and Performing Arts at the University of Portsmouth. Lizzy's previous roles include Annie in *Annie Get Your Gun*, Hodel in *Fiddler On The Roof*, Ado Annie in *Oklahomal* and Shelley Parker in *BatBoy*. She was a member of Kent's Hazlitt Youth Theatre for 4 years, and at the age of 17 she was part of the original cast of YMT:UK's *Frankenstein*. She was also a member of London's UK Theatre School. Lizzy has also directed several productions herself, including Roald Dahl's *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory* and Gilbert and Sullivan's *The Gondoliers*. *Jekyll and Hyde* is her first production with SDMS.

Jan teaches singing for Portsmouth High School and Havant Stagecoach, and has also performed extensively in theatre. Previous roles include Polly in *Crazy For You*, Adele in *Die Fleidermaus*, Lina Lamont in *Singin' in the Rain*, Millie in *Seven Brides for Seven Brothers*, Charity in *Sweet Charity*, Dolly in *Hello Dolly*, Yum Yum in *Hot Mikado*, Beggar Woman in *Sweeney Todd*, The Witch in *Into the Woods*, Nancy in *Oliver*, and Lois in *Kiss Me Kate*. Jan is off to Scotland for a sell-out concert back in her home town Dundee at the Whitehall Theatre in October but is delighted to be once again performing here on the Ferneham Hall stage tonight. She has had a 2 and half years "break" of the leg kind but glad to be on the mend and back to treading the boards. #### The Father


Sir Danuers Carew - Brian Sweatman
