

Ann Elouise Standen

Elouise has been a member of SDMS since 2005 and is delighted to be playing the part of Ann, moving away from her usual character roles and giving her a new and enjoyable challenge. Previous credits include Lilly in Annie, Hattie in Kiss Me Kate, Gertie in Oklahoma! and Zelda in Singin' in the Rain. Elouise is also the Principal and Director/ Producer of the South Downe Stage School, the junior version of SDMS. Having spent a year being an assistant producer to Audrey Pring, Elouise took over in May of last year. She has just finished directing her first show - Little Shop of Horrors, which was performed in March.

Steve joined SDMS in 1997 and has enjoyed principal roles in Singin' In The Rain (twice), *Me and My Girl, My One and Only, My Fair Lady* and was most recently seen as Drake in *Annie*.

This is only her second show with the company but she is enjoying being part of such a friendly society. Since the age of three, Victoria has always enjoyed dancing, singing and musical theatre. In 35 years with SDMS Brian has enjoyed roles in Finian's Rainbow, Showboat, Sweeney Todd, 42nd Street and the title role in Picwick (twice). This is his third Half A Sixpence and he plans to continue singing and acting for many years to come.

SiD Matt Sackman

This is Matt's third show with SDMS following roles in Summer Holiday and Jekyll & Hyde. Matt has directed for groups including Dynamo Youth Theatre and Curtain Call, and is currently on a Creative and Performing Arts Course at Portsmouth University. He also regularly gigs with his band as synth player.

Mr Shalford Tom Hudson

Tom moved down South from his native North East in 1978. He joined Havant Light Opera in 1981 and undertook parts in numerous Gilbert and Sullivan operettas. In 1995 he joined SDMS to be in Carmen and has been a member of the group ever since. In fact Tom is now Honorary Secretary. Although he is pleased to be playing Shalford, he shares the company's sadness that it is due to the illness of Tony Collins that he stepped into the role at the last minute.

Mrs Walsingham Jane Pegler

Jane runs the SDMS Concert Party, who have recently performed at the Kings for the Lord Mayor. She also teaches would-be performers, with many of her students attaining full scholarships to major theatre schools. Her most recent role was as Dorothy Brock in 42nd Street.

Young Walsingham Simon Halstead

This is Simon's first show with SDMS, having been involved with Stagecoach before, playing roles such as Danny in *Grease*, Seymour in *Little Shop of Horrors* and Harold Hill in *Music Man*. Aged just 17, he has been performing since the age of 7, and also plays a variety of different instruments including guitar, piano, flute, violin and drums. Simon also tried (unsuccessfully) to get Alan to be proficient on the banjo! Simon's aim is to become a Drama Teacher and open his own school. He is currently studying at Portsmouth Grammar School.
